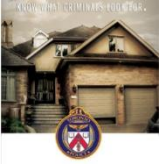

A quick and accurate description of events, vehicles, and persons can make all the difference in apprehending a potential criminal.

Any type of activity or circumstance that seems unusual should be reported.

NEIGHBOURHOOD SAFETY DEPENDS ON NEIGHBOURS DO YOU KNOW YOUR NEIGHBOURS?

A healthy and vibrant neighbourhood can be so much more than a collection of houses on the same street or within the same area.

A neighbourhood can foster both personal and property related safety, as well as helping to keep children and the elderly safe and healthy.

Life is busy and finding time to get to know those around you is not always easy, but taking a few minutes and sharing some basic contact information can greatly improve your safety and security.

ASK YOURSELF THESE IMPORTANT QUESTIONS:

- Do you know the first name of at least 5 different neighbours? What about the house behind you?
- Do you know the street address of your back door neighbour and do they know yours? Would you be able to tell the police the address in the event that you witnessed a break and enter?
- If you know someone elderly in your neighbourhood, would you be able to reach a family member in the event of an emergency?
- Would your neighbours know your name and contact information to give the police in an emergency?
